Qualified PE Teacher (Mr Dunford) to work with children and teachers one day per week.	£9,000	Children have received high quality PE teaching which has developed children's physical literacy. Teachers are now more confident in teaching their own PE, so children constantly receive a high quality PE curriculum. Children also now receive more timetabled curriculum PE time, as teachers are now teaching more PE.	Teachers have become more engaged in the teaching of PE, and now have greater understanding and experience. Teachers are now far happier to teach their own PE lessons, than previously.	Children will continue to be taught by Mr Dunford, and teachers will continue to work alongside him to continue their development in PE teaching. We hope that teacher's will become more confident in taking children to competitions.



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After School Multi Sport Club	£1,100	Children's attendance at the after school club has increased due to being subsidised, and also the flexibility a 'multi-sport' approach brings, rather than being one specific sport. Children gain experience of working with an external coach, as well as children from different classes.	This would continue to be subsidised as it has seen an increase in children participation in after school activity.	The club will be promoted further to increase participation, and hope to add additional clubs.
After School Netball Club	£1,260	Children have had opportunity to learn a sport that is not currently covered in the PE curriculum.	This is now delivered by a member of Hummersea teaching staff, and they will continue to deliver the club in future.	Use expertise within the staff to offer an increased range of after school activities.
New PE equipment (tennis balls, footballs, hoops etc)	£300	Children now have a great experience in PE as the additional equipment can allow for children to work individually and in small groups to further develop their skills and collaborative work. This has also allowed for the Play Leaders to utilise more equipment on a play and lunch time to engage more children in activity.	The school will continue to reinvest when equipment needs replenishing. Play Leaders have a responsibility to look after equipment so that it remains in good condition.	Audit the current equipment to see what may need replacing in future, and if there is anything additional that may enhance the teaching of PE.



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Core Activities Book	£35	Teachers are more confident with assessing children in PE, now that there is a resource to set assessment tasks. Teachers have seen increased progress in children as the tasks highlight gaps in children's skills and understanding, which can then be addressed.	This will continually improve the quality of PE teaching as teachers become more and more confident with the book, and teaching PE. Teachers can use the book to generate ideas for teaching, so children receive a more challenging PE curriculum.	Continue to use the Core Activities resource.
Subsidising Residential	£18,030	Children have been more able to access to residential trips due to the school subsidising the some of the cost. This has allowed more children to experience outdoor activities which have helped with team building and self esteem. On their return to school, many of the children have increased confidence.	This will continue in future as the children gain valuable life experience from the residential and learn how to be safe and to look after each other.	The residential will be booked in again for the next academic year.
